Scope	AYSO Invitational – open to AYSO teams ONLY from ALL Sections.
When	Saturday, Sunday & Monday, May 23-25, 2020; Rain Dates: June 6-7, 2020
Where	Mountain View Middle School & Valley View High School, Moreno Valley, CA. There is no charge for parking. No pets are allowed on the fields.
Who	Girls teams in age division U19 (11v11) with 18 players max.; boys and girls teams in the following age divisions: U16 (11v11) with 18 players max., U14 (11v11) with 15 players max., U12 (9v9) with 12 players max. and U10 (7v7) with 10 players max. All players must be registered and must have played in their most recent primary program. Guest players will be allowed (3 maximum per team). There will be no co-ed teams accepted.
What	Pool play tournament. Each team will be guaranteed 4 games in pool play. The top teams will advance to the medal round on Monday. All pool games will be as follows: 60 min. for U14 thru U19, 50 min for U12, and 40 min for U10.
Why	The Thunderbird Classic Tournament is being conducted as a fundraiser by Region 187 to raise funds for equipment, maintenance, field development and to offset lighting cost.
Awards	According to the official team application and roster, all players and coaches on the official team application and roster will receive a T-shirts and medals for 1 st through 4 th place teams for U10 thru U14 and 1 st and 2 nd place teams for U16 and U19.
Entry Fee, Refunds	\$450 for U14 thru U19, \$425 for U12 and \$400 for U10. A full refund will be issued if tournament is canceled and cannot be rescheduled, or if a team withdraws 30 or more days before the tournament. Within 30 days of the tournament, no refund is provided unless a replacement team is found.
Referee Fee, Refunds	A \$200 referee deposit is required for each team. Each team is asked to provide a qualified 3-person referee team to cover 4 games during the tournament. If referee assignments have been completed, the referee deposit will be refunded within 14 days of the tournament.
Rules	A full set of tournament rules are posted on the tournament website.
Acceptance	The application deadline is no later than May 1, 2020 and will be accepted on a first-come first-serve basis. All teams will be notified within 48 hours of the application receipt as to their status.
How	Team entry applications and all necessary forms are available on the tournament website. Please send ONE (1) Region check payable to AYSO Region 187 that covers both the Entry and Referee fees, along with the completed application with the necessary forms to the tournament address below. 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ACCEPTANCE MATERIALS PACKET

Applications are now being accepted for entrance into the AYSO Colorado River Open Invitational Tournament.

The deadline to apply for the tournament is **May 1, 2020**. Applications accepted by that date will be given priority for acceptance into the tournament; all others will be accepted based on any available openings.

Applications will be accepted on a first-come basis, based on a completed application. To be considered complete, your application must include all of the following:

- 1) Coach Acknowledgment Statement - To be signed by the Head Coach.
- 2) Team Application Form - signed by the Head Coach and the Regional Commissioner.
- 3) Team Roster Form - signed by your Regional Commissioner.

Roster Notes:

- Alternatively, AYSO teams may submit a Blue Sombrero Tournament Roster form, however it must include the names of the Head Coach and Assistant Coach and be signed by your Regional Commissioner.
- Roster changes will be allowed up until Team Check-in; after that, no roster changes. All roster changes must be approved by your Regional Commissioner or Organization President/Registrar.
- Rosters must be comprised solely of players who were registered to play in the most recent AYSO / Organization primary season program.
- Up to 3 guest players may be added to your roster from a neighboring AYSO region or Organization team. In this case, the guest player's Regional Commissioner or Organization President/ Registrar must sign the roster.
- Roster changes will NOT be accepted after May 15, 2020. All roster changes must be approved by your Regional Commissioner.
- Player roster limits are as follows (unless the team has larger normal roster and gets advance permission from tournament director):

- 4) The completed Referee Form signed by your organizations appropriate Referee Administrator (if you're not planning to bring referees, just check the box on the Referee Form and return it without signature).
- 5) Youth Referee Authorization Form - signed by your Regional Referee Administrator, ONLY if your referee crew has a youth referee.
- 6) A single Regional / Organization check for the total amount of the Team Entry Fee and the Referee Commitment Deposit.

If accepted, it will be assumed that you intend for your team to play the entire tournament, and to return if necessary on the rainout alternative dates (in the event that becomes necessary).

If your team is not accepted, you will be offered the opportunity to be placed on a waiting list, or if you prefer we will return your application to you within 48 hours of your request.

Additional Notes:

- 1) Teams will be grouped into one or more groups per Division based on the type of team and team rating. Teams will play a minimum of 4 qualifying matches. In divisions where there are sufficient teams, these will be bracketed into multiple flights. Group winners will advance to medal rounds on Monday.
- 2) We will be having a friendly gift exchange between the teams at the end of each game during the handshakes. **Please bring a token of friendship for all the players on each opposing team for each of the Pool Play games you will be playing.**

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REFUND AND RESCHEDULE POLICY

A team will be given a full refund if:

- 1) The team is not accepted into the tournament.
- 2) The team voluntarily withdraws from the tournament before acceptance.
- 3) The team voluntarily withdraws from the tournament after acceptance but more than 30 days prior to the tournament.

Any team that voluntarily withdraws from the tournament once they have been accepted (including teams that do not attend if the tournament has been rescheduled for any reason), but less than 30 days prior to the tournament, will receive a refund based on the following conditions:

- 4) **Teams will receive a refund only if a replacement team can be found.** If the replacement team has been offered a discount on the tournament entry fee or the referee deposit or the replacement team has been offered some other financial incentive to attend the tournament, then the refund to the withdrawing team may be reduced to compensate for the discounted entry fee, referee deposit or other financial incentive.

Refunds for teams not accepted or teams that choose not to be placed on a waiting list will be returned within 48 hours of notification to the name and address as submitted on the original application.

If a team decides to drop from the tournament, an email or a written and signed notification from the Coach will be accepted via email or standard mail. The date on the email or a postmark on the envelope will be the official date of the drop from the tournament for the purpose of issuing a refund.

Rescheduling the Tournament

Should it become necessary to reschedule the tournament due to inclement weather or other reasons beyond the control of the Thunderbird Classic Tournament, the tournament will be rescheduled to June 6-7, 2020 (Rain Date).

In the case of the rescheduled tournament, all teams will be expected to attend on the reschedule dates. Should any team find it necessary to withdraw from the rescheduled tournament, they will only receive a refund based on the criteria in Para. 2 as specified above.

At the time the tournament reschedule decision is made, the Tournament Committee will determine if the tournament will be continued from the point it was terminated, or if it will be started over. If started over, any matches played will be discarded and a revised tournament format, team groupings, rules and match schedule will be posted on the web site.

Canceling the Tournament

Should it become necessary to completely cancel the tournament due to inclement weather or other reasons beyond the scope of the Thunderbird Classic Tournament, a full refund will be issued.

If the tournament is cancelled due to weather after partially completing and it cannot be rescheduled to be completed, refunds will be made to teams on a prorated basis, based on the number of actual games played.

No refund will be given in the event a match is canceled by reason of a registered opponent forfeiting or failing to show up. Every effort will be made to arrange matches against alternative opponents in such circumstances, but this is not guaranteed.

Partial Refunds

If one or more matches cannot be played either at the originally scheduled time or at some other reasonable time within the tournament weekend, refunds will be given on the following basis:

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REFEREE PLAN

To be eligible for the full referee deposit refund, the Referee Registration Form must be received by the Tournament Registrar no later than May 1, 2020. The referee deposit will be refunded no later than 14 days of the tournament completion ONLY if the following guidelines are completely met.

CATEGORY	RULE
1) Commitment Requirements	<p>A. Each team participating in the Thunderbird Classic Tournament must provide at least 1 crew consisting of 3 qualified referees.</p> <p>B. The Thunderbird Classic Referee Information Form must be completed, approved by the Regional Referee Administrator, and returned with the Team Application.</p> <p>C. Each referee team will be asked to officiate a maximum of 4 matches during the tournament. These may be game assignments or standby assignments, which will be considered equal in terms of earning the referee deposit refund.</p> <p>D. If all assignments are completed, the entire referee deposit of \$200 will be refunded within 14 days of the completion of the tournament. If only partial assignments are completed, then a partial refund will be provided equal to the proportion of assignments completed.</p> <p>E. The deposit refund check will be returned to the address shown on the Team Application form.</p> <p>F. Remember: the quality of officiating is largely dependent upon the experience and abilities of the referees you provide.</p>
2) Qualification Requirements	<p>A. Each referee must be an AYSO registered and trained volunteer, and Safe Haven certified and CDC Concussion certified.</p> <p>B. Each referee must be versed in the Laws of the Game, including current law changes and capable of applying the laws according to the spirit of the game.</p> <p>C. Players in the tournament will not be allowed to officiate.</p> <p>D. Coaches in this tournament are strongly discouraged from officiating so that scheduling of referees with the best experience and without conflicts can be accomplished. If an exception is warranted due to lack of other referee volunteers, this must be approved in advance by the Thunderbird Classic Referee Administrator.</p> <p>E. Youth referees will only be allowed if they are not a player in the tournament. Youth referees must be approved by their Regional Referee Administrator, by completing the Thunderbird Classic Youth Referee Authorization Form. These referees must have this form with their Youth Volunteer Application form attached with them at all times and present it to any Tournament official upon request.</p> <p>F. Youth referees will only be assigned to games where they are qualified and at least 2 years older than the age group they are officiating.</p>
3) Uniform Requirement	<p>A. All referees must be in full Uniform as defined by AYSO and USSF, including the AYSO Referee Badge. In inclement weather, black rain pants or black warm-up pants will be permitted in addition to the official uniform.</p> <p>A. The Gold uniform will be considered the primary color of referee uniform for this tournament. The referee crew will be expected to change to an alternate color in case of conflict with either of the teams' uniforms.</p> <p>B. Referees not in uniform will not be permitted to referee games, and their team's referee deposit may be subject to forfeiture.</p>

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<p>4) Competency Requirements</p>	<p>A. Referees will be assigned to games as follows: U10 & U12: Regional Badge or higher U14 & U16: Intermediate Badge or higher / USSF Grade 8 or higher U19: Advance Badge or higher / USSF Grade 8 or higher Any exceptions must have the prior written approval of the Thunderbird Classic Referee Administrator.</p> <p>B. Every effort will be made to assign referees to neutral games at their level of competency or below. In rare cases, referee crews may be asked to split up in order to meet these goals.</p>
<p>5) Tournament Rules</p>	<p>A. Referees will be expected to familiarize themselves with and uphold the tournament rules, AYSO guidelines and FIFA laws. Any failure of the referee to uphold these rules may be cause for dismissal from the tournament, and will place a team's referee deposit refund in jeopardy.</p> <p>B. Only the diagonal system of control will be used.</p> <p>C. Referees will be expected to fill out the game cards and to keep track of substitutions.</p> <p>D. Referees will be expected to note on the back of the game cards and to fill out misconduct reports immediately after the game in which a misconduct (caution and/or send-off) was issued to a player or coach, or if there were spectator interference problems, or any other action that merits a report.</p> <p>E. Referees will be expected to turn in all completed game cards and misconduct reports to the Referee Station immediately after each game.</p>
<p>6) Referee Schedules</p>	<p>A. Referee schedules will be posted on the web site within 3 days of the tournament. Each team will be expected to ensure that the referee schedule and check-in instructions have been provided to their referee crew.</p>
<p>7) Use of Local Referees</p>	<p>A. Additional referees will be provided by the host region, including from the surrounding regions and Areas to ensure all games are covered by qualified referees. These referees will be provided assignments on a stand-by or fill-in basis only. Priority will be given to referee crews to ensure an opportunity to earn their deposit refund.</p>
<p>8) Referee Check-In</p>	<p>A. All referees will be expected to check in at the Referee Station upon their arrival at the tournament, to register and to collect their Referee Card, which contains a summarized set of tournament rules that they will be expected to administer.</p> <p>B. Referees are expected to check in at the Referee Station at least 30 minutes prior to their assigned game. Failure to appear on time may result in a replacement referee crew being assigned to the field. Once a replacement crew has been assigned, they will have priority and the original crew must report to the Referee station for alternative assignment.</p>
<p>9) Referee Mementos</p>	<p>A. Referees will be provided with a meal ticket for food and drink for each day that they officiate. Chilled water and snacks will also be available at the Referee Station.</p> <p>B. Participating referees will receive a flipping coin as mementos to thank them for their contribution.</p> <p>C. Special gifts will be given to those referees officiating final matches on Monday.</p>

CATEGORY	RULE
1) Jurisdiction	<p>A. Unless otherwise noted, the current AYSO National Rules and Regulations, Section 1 and FIFA Laws of the game will be used for this tournament. The following rules are intended specifically for this tournament ONLY!</p> <p>B. The Tournament Committee (incl. Tournament Directors, Field Coordinators, Referee Administrator and other designated staff) will have jurisdiction over all games played. Disputes will be resolved by the end of the soccer day. Referee judgment calls are NOT subject to dispute or protest!</p>
2) Fees	<p>A. Entire fee and referee deposit must accompany tournament application and will be returned, if application is not accepted. Fee must be a single check issued from the respective Region's account (no personal checks).</p> <p>B. Fees are: \$600 (entry fee \$400 plus referee deposit \$200) for U10; \$625 (entry fee \$425 plus referee deposit \$200) for U12; \$650 (entry fee \$450 plus referee deposit \$200) for U14 through U19.</p>
3) Acceptance	<p>A. Applications are due no later than May 1, 2020.</p> <p>B. Applications will be accepted on a first-come basis, based on completed application (see Team Application Form for criteria). Teams will be notified by email within 48 hours of the receipt of their applications.</p> <p>C. Teams not accepted into the Tournament will be offered the opportunity to be placed on a waiting list or have their application returned within 48 hours.</p> <p>D. The primary form of communication between the Tournament and applying teams will be email and the Tournament website. Teams must designate a Team Contact on their application who has email and Internet access, if not the Coach or Assistant Coach.</p>
4) Refunds	<p>A. Teams withdrawing 30 days or more before the tournament will be issued a full refund will be issued within 48 hours of request.</p> <p>B. Teams withdrawing less than 30 days before the start of the tournament will only be issued a refund if a replacement team can be found according to Section 2 of the "REFUND AND RESCHEDULE POLICY".</p> <p>C. If the tournament is canceled and cannot be rescheduled a full refund will be issued will be issued within 48 hours of notification.</p> <p>D. For teams that are eligible, referee deposit refunds will be mailed no later than 14 days after the end of the tournament.</p>
5) Rainout / Cancellation	<p>A. Should the tournament be rained out on the original date, it will be rescheduled to the weekend of June 6-7, 2020 and all teams will be expected to return on that date to resume the tournament, unless indicated otherwise on the Team Application Form. Any team not able to return will only receive a refund if a replacement team can be found.</p>

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	<p>I. There will be no warming up on the field. Teams must warm up prior to taking the field. As soon as the previous game has ended, teams must clear the field and the teams for the next game must take their places.</p> <p>J. FORFEITS: There will be a five-minute grace period at the start of the game for a team to take the field before a forfeit is declared. The score for a forfeit match will be 2-0 for the remaining team (see STANDINGS for the points to be awarded). For U10 division teams, there is a minimum of 5 players on the field to continue a game. For U12, the minimum number is 7 players. For all other divisions, there must be a minimum of 7 players to continue a game.
